Update: Holywell

Greetings from Holywell! We are glad to see spring coming here with the daffodils and the arrival of many lambs on the hills We are in around us. preparation for Easter and praying for visitors – though this is not typically a service where we have had visitors. In order of importance, first and foremost, we are continuing to search for a minister to take over Bethel Baptist Chapel in Holywell. I met with a retired Welsh minister in January to see if he had any candidates in mind. No response there. I we are conservative for him and his contacts - it is sad to see liberal doctrines creep into the church over here, particularly in many Baptist chapels. In this case, it regarded the ordination of women. They do so much rationalizing, but it is simply not in the Bible. So, the search continues. God knows who we need.

On a plus note, we have started monthly services at a second local care home in Holywell. As a reminder, this came out of going there for several years at Christmas to sina carols with the residents. second facility, called Llys Gwenffrwd, is for mainly elderly individuals which require full-time While I bring a short message, what they really appreciate and respond to are hymns! Even though many are not able to read the words we bring (which are printed large), they at least know the chorus to the hymns and many of the words. The formal part of the service runs about ½ hour but we spend about an hour after just visiting with them. We have about 8 residents coming along with several nurses/carers. It is really an uplifting time and they appreciate that we come to encourage them from the Bible - a few



even finish Bible verses as I am reading them.

I had the opportunity to teach Old Testament Survey III (History books) at BBC GB in February. There were 4 students plus a fifth is taking it offline as of the writing of this letter. The good part is that I am able to teach from Holywell via the internet and the classes are recorded. preparing to teach the Apologetics course at the end of April (a new one for me). It is good to invest in the next generation of teachers and preachers. Prayerfully, we will see someone perhaps called to pastor in Wales through the Bible college.

Mary and I are consciously delegating more responsibilities to the congregation, like planning quarterly dinners. The response has been slow and some events may not happen, but will be healthy in the long run. It is a little like the "little red hen" at times.

summer camp this year – it would be great to have them all attend. Please be in prayer that they invite their friends to our weekly club and continue being sensitive to the Gospel.

Things continue well with the RAF Air Cadets. There has been a lot of turn-over in the group since before our furlough both with the cadets and leadership. It just opens more opportunities to remind them why the RAF has padres in their squadrons.

Our weekly **Bible** study systematically going through the Bible is being well attended. The better part is that those that are coming really want to learn. We even have a former chapel member following online in Bulgaria. Prayerfully, I am looking at some future leaders in the chapel as they grow in the knowledge of the Lord.
