Greetings from Wales in the name of our dear Saviour, Jesus Christ. The days are getting long again with scattered light visible on the horizon near 11 pm we have not gotten over this in 13 years on the field. This spring has gone quickly over here. We had a good Easter service at the chapel, but the best part was holding our first Easter service at a local limited care home. Plas Yr Ywen. We had about 20 residents come down to participate in it. As a result, they have asked us if we will hold a monthly service in their facility. We will be starting this on the first Sunday in June and continue on after that. Prayerfully, this will be a blessina to the residents as we minster the gospel to them as well as provide a growth opportunity for our members in music as well as bringing a message. As a reminder, this facility houses about 85 residents the local

I have had a busy spring, teaching 2 courses at BBC GB - Old Testament Survey 3 (Samuel-Nehemiah) and Intro. to Missions. It is a blessing investing in the next generation of Christian leaders and workers. I had hoped to teach an Ecclesiology course but swapped the missions class instead to help one of the college leaders in his scheduling.

The younger age group is much more teachable, yet a few teens are starting to ask "real" questions about God. Unfortunately, the older youth tend to be more disruptive and make it difficult to teach a lesson (this is a cultural problem we deal with). In fact, our older youth became less respectful after they entered high school – go figure. Pray for us for workers for the labourers are few.
